It’s Handover Season

We are often asked when is the best time to handover?

Our experience over the last 24 years is that the best practice is to hand over as soon as possible.

For public schools this is normally in August of each year as public schools have to by law ensure the Exemption Act processes have been followed and that their Section 41 letters have been sent and that the required three month waiting period has expired.

CeeBee can process your Section 41 letters on your behalf.

The benefits of handing over early are:

- It stops your school fees Prescribing
- Rehabilitates bad payers
- Minimizes debt rolling over
- Improves your schools cash flow
- The ‘younger’ the debt is, the easier it is to collect.
- It gives your internal collection process “teeth”
- Your paying parents appreciate something is being done.

To use all you need is an internet connection and a web browser, such as Microsoft Edge, Internet Explorer, Chrome, or Firefox.
